The American Psychological Association (APA) uses a name-date system in which short in-text citations direct the readers to the full reference list entry. Below you will find tips and examples for both elements. For exceptions, details, and many more examples, refer to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, Seventh Edition* (2020), especially chapters eight through ten. If you need more assistance, <u>contact Research Services</u> at the Rice Library.

The in-text citation is usually the author name(s) followed by the year of publication. Page numbers are only included if there is a direct quote from the source. In most cases, you will put the parenthetical citation at the end of the sentence describing the work cited. You can also include the name of the author within your text for a narrative citation.

The reference list at the end of a paper provides the information necessary to identify and retrieve each work cited in the text. Begin the reference list on a new page after the text. Place the section label References in bold at the top of the page, centered. Order the reference list entries alphabetically by the last name of the first author. Double-space the entire reference list and apply a hanging indent of 0.5 inch to each reference list entry. (Both of these settings can be made in Word's Paragraph options window.)
